



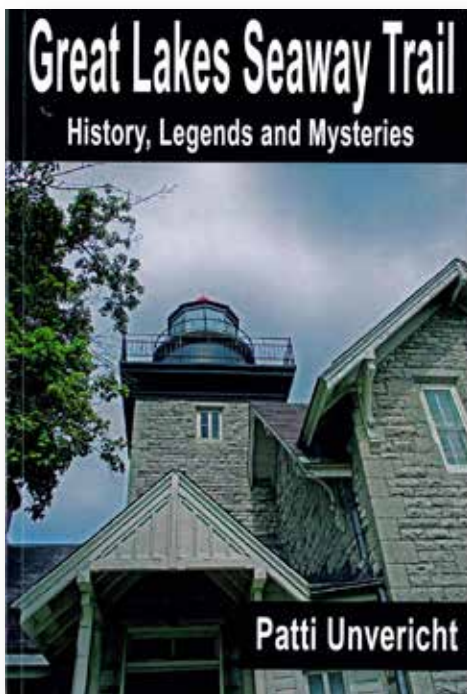

The Great Lakes Seaway Trail runs along the southern and eastern shores of Lake Ontario, as well as along the St. Lawrence River. The trail is as rich in history as it is in scenery. Many battles during the War of 1812 were fought on this shore. Islands in the river have disappeared after horrific murders and mysterious men tried to hide from their indiscretions among them. Along the Seaway Trail a house was built for Napoleon Bonaparte before he died in exile. And the spirits of soldiers remain stationed at their posts. Here is an Insert from the Book:



ALEXANDRIA BAY

When you mention going on a trip to the Thousands Islands, people automatically think of Alexandria Bay. The arch over Church Street headed in to the ill age seconds that thought, saying it all "Welcome to Alexandria Bay the Heart of the Thousand Island." It started as a small settlement in 1811, but like other towns and villages on the river more people moved to the area after the end of the War of 1812. It didn't become a tourist destination, though, until the turn of the 20th century.
